



GLOBAL EDUCATION AND STUDY ABROAD OPPORTUNITIES FOR TEACHERS

Since 1995, Go Global NC (formerly the Center for International Understanding) has provided study abroad programs to help educators bring the world to North Carolina classrooms. Teachers from all grade levels and all subject areas use what they learned to ignite an interest in global cooperation and competition. Teachers have traveled to places like Singapore and Malaysia.

World View – Teacher Study Abroad Programs

The goal of the study visit is to help educators become leaders for global education by looking beyond North Carolina's borders and experiencing cultures and countries that may be very different than their own. Typical World View study visits include visits to schools, colleges, and non-governmental organizations. We also explore significant cultural and historical sites. World View study visits provide a unique and challenging professional development opportunity—not a tourist trip!

World Affairs Council of Charlotte –Council Scholar Award Program

The Council Scholar Award Program, now in its 23rd year, is designed to annually reward outstanding teachers, grades K-12, in Mecklenburg and the surrounding county community who have demonstrated a commitment to, and interest in, international education.

Generation Study Abroad Institute of International Education – Resources for Teachers

AIFS Foundation Generation Study Abroad Enrichment Grants is a professional development program to support U.S. secondary level (grades 6-12) teachers who have shown to be outstanding advocates for study abroad. The goal of the program is to help raise global awareness in the classroom and prepare students for global citizenship and study abroad.

Fulbright-Hays Seminars Abroad and Study Abroad Enrichment Grants

The Fulbright-Hays Seminars Abroad Program provides short-term seminars abroad for K-12 U.S. administrators and educators in the social sciences and humanities to improve their understanding and knowledge of the peoples and cultures of other countries. The program offers educational lectures and activities specifically designed for the group, including visits to local schools and organizations, meetings with educators and students, visits to cultural sites. Participants draw on their experiences during the program to create new, cross-cultural curricula for their classrooms and school systems back in the U.S.

Global Connections and Exchange

The Global Connections and Exchange (GCE) Program supports collaboration and online linkages among students, educators, and community youth leaders from U.S. and overseas secondary schools and youth organizations.

Teachers for Global Classrooms

The Teachers for Global Classrooms Program (TGC) allows U.S. middle and high school teachers to participate in an online professional development course, two Washington, D.C.-based symposiums and a two-week professional development exchange.

Fulbright Public Policy Fellowship

The Fulbright Public Policy Fellowship will allow fellows to serve in professional placements in foreign government ministries or institutions and gain hands-on public sector experience in participating foreign countries while simultaneously carrying out an academic research/study project.

Distinguished Fulbright Awards in Teaching Program

The Distinguished Fulbright Awards in Teaching sends select U.S. primary and secondary school teachers abroad for three to six months to pursue projects, conduct research, take courses and lead master classes or seminars for teachers and students.

Fulbright Travel-Only Grants

Grants for international travel are available to Germany, Hungary and Italy to supplement other fellowships that do not include travel costs or to supplement a student's own funds for study/research.

Fulbright International Education Administrators Program

The International Education Administrators (IEA) seminars program helps international education professionals and senior higher education officials from the United States create empowering connections with the societal, cultural and higher education systems of other countries.

Fulbright Specialist Program

The Fulbright Specialist Program, a short-term complement to the Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program, sends U.S. faculty and professionals to serve as expert consultants on curriculum, faculty development, institutional planning and related subjects at overseas academic institutions for a period of 2 to 6 weeks.

Intensive Summer Language Institutes in China

The Intensive Summer Language Institutes in China is a six-week summer programs that provide the opportunity to study abroad to U.S. K-12 teachers and community college instructors of Chinese (Mandarin).

Educational Seminars for U.S. Citizens

The Educational Seminars provide K-12 school administrators with opportunities to improve their understanding of international educational practices and approaches.

Fulbright Classroom Teacher Exchange Program

The Fulbright Classroom Teacher Exchange provides opportunities for primary and secondary teachers to exchange positions with colleagues in other countries

English Language Fellow Program

Through the English Language Fellow Program (EL Fellow) highly qualified U.S. educators in the field of Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) participate in 10-month-long fellowships at academic institutions throughout the world.

English Language Specialist Program

U.S. academics and professionals in the fields of Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL) and Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) for short-term (two to sixteen weeks) assignments abroad.
