Vision:

Harper Middle College High School will accelerate the future goals of every student through a respectful, positive, and service-oriented environment where courageous students successfully complete an associate's degree and a high school diploma while in high school.

Goals:

Duty-free planning: Provide a duty-free instructional planning time for every teacher under G.S.115C-105.27 and -301.1, with the goal of proving an average of at least five hours of planning time per week, with the maximum extent that the safety and proper supervision of students may allow during regular student contact hours. ALIGN TO: A2.04

Duty Free Lunch: To provide a duty-free lunch period for every teach on a daily basis. ALIGN TO: A4.06

Bullying Prevention: Provide a positive school climate, under CMS regulation JICK-R, by promoting a safe learning environment free of bullying and harassing behaviors. ALIGN TO: A4.06

Maintain the proportionality of our Out-of-School Suspension (OSS) data for Black students at 0% in SY2022-23 and SY2023-24. (Aligns to A4.06 and CMS Guardrail 1)

The percent of students reporting a positive self-perception of their self efficacy will increase from 61% on the Fall 2021 Panorama Screener (in Grades 6-12) to 66% in SY2022-23 and 71% in SY2023-24. (Aligns to A4.06 and CMS Guardrail 3)

The percent of high school students who score at the College and Career (CCR) level -- a 4 or 5 -- on the Math 3 EOC (grades 9-12) will increase from 28% in SY2021-22 to 33% in SY2022-23 and 38% in SY2023-24.

The percentage of high school students who score a level 3 or higher on AP Exams will increase from N% to N% in 2022-2023. AP Eng Language 91.7% to 94% AP Eng Literature 88.9% to 92% AP Calculus AB/BC 37.5% to 47% AP US History - (Aligns to A2.04)
