II. OPPORTUNITIES: SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOALS

By June 2022, Stoney Creek students in grades 3-5 will exceed the GLP target of 38% and the CCR target of 27% in reading as measured by the EOG. By June 2022, Stoney Creek students in grades K-2 will increase proficiency in reading by 10 percentage points from BOY

to EOY as measured by the EL Education benchmark assessments. All students will receive a minimum of 1 hour of standard based whole group instruction using the EL curriculum in order to ensure equity across the school. All students will receive a minimum of 30 minutes of differentiated small group instruction based on data in order to meet their individual needs. (A2.04, A4.01, B3.03).

By June 2022, Stoney Creek students in grades 3-5 will exceed the GLP target of 43% and the CCR target of 24.5% in math as measured by the EOG. By June 2021, Stoney Creek students in grades k-2 will increase proficiency in math by 10 percentage points from BOY to EOY as measured by the CMS quarterly assessments. All students will actively engage and participate in EnVision 20/20 math curriculum each day. (A2.04, A4.01, B3.03).

By June 2022, Stoney Creek will decrease the number of unexcused absences by 10% as compared with 2020-2021 results. All students will be encouraged to attend school on-time, all day, every day. (A4.06, E1.06)

By June 2022, Stoney Creek students in Grade 5 will exceed the GLP target of 65.2% and the CCR target of 55.8% in science as measured by the EOG. All students will engage in their NCSCOS grade level standards for science instruction each day. (A2.04, A4.01, B3.03).

III. CHIEF CHALLENGES

- Gaps in learning increased during COVID, so staying aligned to grade level expectations, scope, and sequence, while also remediating is challenging for teachers and students.
- Social Emotional Learning--With limited interpersonal interactions during the pandemic, communication and collaboration skills are limited and lacking amongst students, families, and staff.
- Staff shortage--We currently have had more resignations and vacancies this year which impacts continuity with teaching and providing student supports.
- We do not have substitutes who consistently pick up for absences. As a result, teachers cover classes which impacts their ability to participate in PLC planning meetings.

IV. PLANS FOR THE YEAR: SIP ACTIONS

- Utilizing core action steps walkthrough form weekly to ensure alignment, feedback, and calibration.
- We continue to improve our House systems (based on the Ron Clark Academy) to ensure staff and student morale remain high.
